Week One

Desperate for His Presence


As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God.

Psalm 42:1

During the hot, dry days of summer, we hunger for something to quench our thirst. Today we have a desire that our lives would have a thirst for the presence and work of Christ.

Today we, as a church family, pray:

- For God's Spirit to give us a thirst for the presence and work of Christ.
- · That we would turn our focus and attention to God's presence.
- That we would ask Christ to be the only thing that quenches our thirst.



One thing I ask from the Lord, this only do I seek: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze on the beauty of the Lord and to seek him in his temple.

Psalm 27:4

This verse summarizes for us a heart that is focused on living in God's presence. Once we experience Him, then we will understand the "beauty" of being in His presence.

Today we join together and pray:

- That our hearts would be focused on experiencing His presence.
- That we will have a hunger to see and understand the "beauty" of being with Him.
- That we will take time today to "dwell" (hang out) in who He is.

You, God, are my God, earnestly I seek you; I thirst for you, my whole being longs for you, in a dry and parched land where there is no water.


² I have seen you in the sanctuary and beheld your power and your glory. ³ Because your love is better than life, my lips will glorify you.

Psalm 63:1-3

In these verses, David speaks to two things about his relationship with God – his experience of who God is and his desire for God's presence. When we understand the immensity of God's power and the depth of God's love for us, it drives us to "long" for more of His presence and "glorify" His Name.

As a church family we join together and pray:

- · That we would long for more of God's presence in our lives.
- That our hearts would grasp the depths of His love for us.
- That our lips would glorify God.



You make known to me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore.

Psalm 16:11

The offer we have in God's presence is "fullness of joy" and "pleasures forevermore." While the world tries to offer us these things, it can never fulfill. But what we have in Christ is joy in the here and now, and life eternal.

Today, as the people of God, we pray:

- That we would walk in the "path of life" that God lays out for us.
- That our hearts would know the "fullness of joy" we have in Christ, despite our circumstances.
- That we would rest in the hope we have in Christ.

Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence?


8 If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there. 9 If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, 10 even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast.

Psalm 139:7-10

When we think of God's full awareness of our lives, thoughts, desires, and actions, it can be overwhelming. But when we understand God's thoughts, desires, and heart for us, it should provide us with peace. His presence is constantly with us to lead, guide, direct, and "hold us fast." Therefore, we should not fear His presence, but find rest in the love of the Father for His children.

Today, in God's presence we pray:

- That we would find peace in God's presence.
- That God's presence would be a shelter and safe place to rest.
- That God would lead, guide, and direct us by His Spirit.



Week Two

Grateful for His Forgiveness


"Come now, let us settle the matter," says the Lord "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red as crimson, they shall be like wool."

Isaiah 1:18

This verse reminds us that it is not our changed behavior that causes forgiveness and restoration. Rather, changed behavior shows true repentance and complete dependence on God that make forgiveness possible. Ultimately, our restoration is entirely dependent on the sacrifice of Jesus.

Today, as a church family, let's pray:

- · That we recognize how much God loves us.
- To thank God for the sacrifice of Jesus for our sins.
- To remember that "the matter is settled" once we place our faith in Him!



Praise the Lord, my soul; all my inmost being, praise His holy name. ² Praise the Lord, my soul and forget not all His benefits – ³ who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases, ⁴ who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with love and compassion, ⁵ who satisfies your desires with good things so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.

Psalm 103:1-5

God created us, knows us, and loves us. He sent His Son to redeem us and to make us whole. Because of this, He alone deserves all of our praise!

Today, as a body of believers, let's pray:

- That we remember all that God has done for us in Christ Jesus.
- That each day we live would be a day that we praise His holy name.
- That we know that He alone has the power to satisfy the deepest desires of our hearts.


But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, His Son, purifies us from all sin. 8 If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. 9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. 10 If we claim we have not sinned, we make Him out to be a liar and His word is not in us.

1 John 1:7-10

"Walking in the light" describes a life that is characterized by truth and holiness and a willingness to be open to God and His working in our lives. The result is that we can have fellowship with one another, as well as with God Himself!

Today, as a fellowship, let's pray:

- · That we would seek to live lives of truthfulness and honesty.
- That we would be aware of the sin in our lives and be thankful for forgiveness as we confess it to God.
- That we would be open to God's working in our lives to make us more like Him



How much more, then, will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from acts that lead to death, so that we may serve the living God!

Hebrews 9:14

In the Old Testament, God accepted animal sacrifices to make people ceremonially clean on the outside. He has now provided the sacrifice of Jesus for all who place their faith in Him to be made inwardly (and completely) clean.

Today, as a community of faith, let's pray:

- To thank God for the perfect sacrifice of Jesus.
- To thank God that we are not just outwardly clean, but completely clean inwardly in His sight.
- That we recognize we are saved from acts that lead to death so that we may serve a living God!


Who is a God like you, who pardons sin and forgives the transgression of the remnant of His inheritance? You do not stay angry forever but delight to show mercy. ¹⁹ You will again have compassion on us; you will tread our sins underfoot and hurl all our iniquities into the depths of the sea.

Micah 7:18-19

Micah's name means "Who is like the Lord?" His book and these verses tell of God's attributes that serve to accomplish salvation for us. It is His mercy and compassion that lead to our sin being "hurled into the sea" so that we are made right before our perfect God.

Today, as a family of believers, let's pray:

- That we remember that God is like nothing else that we may find ourselves tempted to worship.
- To thank God for separating us completely from our sins.
- And remind ourselves that God delights in showing mercy and compassion to us.



For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more.

Hebrews 8:12

The old covenant lacked the power to accomplish what the sacrifice of Jesus provides. Through the death and resurrection of Jesus, God has given us complete and eternal forgiveness.

Today, as a church, let's pray:

- To thank God for His power to raise Jesus from the dead.
- · Thank Him for his willingness to forgive our sin.
- Thank Him that, by His wonderful grace, He remembers our sins no more!


Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord.

Acts 3:19

Repentance is turning away from sin. Faith is turning to God for salvation. When those things happen, God provides the blessings of a restored relationship with Him.

Today, let's pray together:

- That we are reminded of and grateful for the gift of salvation that God so freely gives us.
- That we thank Him for restoring our relationship with Him.
- To thank God that He provides all that we could ever need through our relationship with Him.



Week Three

Concern for the Lost


Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.

Matthew 28:19-20

In today's world we have become more inward than outward-focused. It has become more about me and my needs. But the Bible tells us that we are to reach the lost and tell of the Good News of Jesus to everyone.

Join me as we pray today for God to:

- Stir our hearts for the lost.
- Allow us to teach them who God is and what He has for them.
- Lead them to believe that God is always with us.



How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in Him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching?

Romans 10:14

In today's high tech world everything we can think of can be accessed on the web. But, if you don't know what you're looking for, you can't find it. There are people today that do not know who Jesus is or what He has done for them because they have never heard.

Today, ask God to:

- · Give you an opportunity to share Jesus today.
- · Give you the right words to say.

And He said to them, 'Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation.'

Mark 16:15

Today, we can travel most anywhere in the world to see the beauties that God has created. From the mountain tops to the seas, it is all before us. God has called us to not only see and marvel at all He has done, but we are to "Go into all the world". It is one thing to be a bystander and simply watch, but God has called us to go and share His love with others.

Today, as we pray together:

- Ask God to lead you into the world to share the Good News of Jesus.
- · Ask Him to open your eyes to where He is working.
- · Thank God that His Spirit goes with us as we share his Word.

In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.

Matthew 5:16

Have you ever been walking through the woods late in the afternoon and realize that the darkness is right on your heels? The pathway grows dim and the light disappears, then you remember that small flashlight in your backpack. All of a sudden the pathway is visible and all who follow in the light return safely. We have that Light of Jesus within us that we are to shine in this dark world so that all may find their way to Him.

Today, let's pray:

- To ask God to help you shine your light for all to see His Good Works
- To ask God to remove any fear in sharing his Word with others.
- That God would be glorified in all that we say and do in His name.


But in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect.

1 Peter 3:15

If you travel much today, you know that you should always be prepared for just about anything – long lines, construction, detours, delays and many other things. It's going to happen, trust me. The same can be said about sharing your faith in Jesus. There will be things said that may frustrate you because of their disbelief or lack of knowledge, but you must stay calm, stay in your lane, and trust God to give you the words to share.

Today, as a church family we pray:

- That God would give you the opportunity to share Jesus with gentleness and respect.
- That God would open our eyes to those around us who need Him
- · That we would walk in holiness, as Christ is holy.



But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.

Acts 1:8

Some of you will remember the good ole days when all your outside lawn tools worked great, as long as you had your electrical extension cords – 25, 50 and even 100 feet! As long as you were connected, everything was great until you ran out of cord. Without power, the work stopped. We are not dependent on power cords or even batteries to do the work that God has called us to do. We have the power of the Holy Spirit that does not need a cord or battery charger. His power is everlasting and has no limits.

Today, filled with God's Spirit, we pray:

- · That God would fill us fresh and anew with His Spirit.
- That, in Christ, we walk in victory as we live as His "witnesses."
- That God would help us to see Trussville as our "Jerusalem" that He has called us to reach for Christ.


For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes...

Romans 1:16

Today, headlines are filled with bad news; a fallen world, economy, and people. There are disasters and destruction everywhere. But there is hope in the Good News! God has given the world His Son, Jesus. We need to stand boldly and let the world see the power of God in this salvation offered through Jesus.

Today, pray that God will help you:

- · Stand boldly in your faith.
- · Share confidently about your faith.
- Show the Love of Christ.



Week Four

Sacrifice for the Next Generation

These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts.


⁷ Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up.

Deuteronomy 6:6-7

Our world is in a mess. But, it's important to remember that we have a message of hope and life to overcome a broken world. Our calling as followers of Christ is to pass on this message of God's goodness and faithfulness to those who will come after us.

Let's pray together:

- Change me, O God. Nothing can happen through me which hasn't happened to me and in me. It is tough for me to expect children to be changed unless something has changed me.
- Help me talk about these things to children not preach, not lecture, not send them off to church (although the church can be an aid).
- May God be recognized everywhere at home and in life.



In the future, when your son asks you, 'What does this mean?' you are to tell him, 'With a mighty hand the LORD brought us out of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.

Exodus 13:14

God wanted to position His people to where He was their only hope. God is absolutely in charge, and he wanted them to understand that if He did not deliver them, they would not be delivered.

Pray today God will:

- Position you where He wants you to be, not where you want to be.
- Help us understand that God's direction is always right, but it may not be the easiest way.
- Help us remember that God's direction always requires faith.

So even to old age and gray hairs, O God, do not forsake me, until I proclaim your might to another generation, your power to all those to come.

Psalm 71:18

This verse is a passionate plea to God for strength and guidance, even in old age. The psalmist acknowledges the unavoidability and reality of old age and the challenges that come with it. Yet also expresses a need to continue to serve and glorify God throughout life, so that the next generation might see our faithfulness to God and choose to follow Him.

Dear Lord, please help me:

- Not waste the experiences You have allowed me to go through.
- Leave a legacy consistent with Your Word that the generations to come will learn of God's power and righteousness.
- · Make the study of Your word a priority in my life.
- Use the phrases and vocabulary of the Scriptures to pray and praise God.

Remember the days of old; consider the years of many generations; ask your father, and he will show you, your elders, and they will tell you.

Deuteronomy 32:7

In this verse, Moses is telling the children of Israel to remember all that the Lord did to protect and provide during their journey in the wilderness. The Lord offers us the same protection and provisions today.

As we pray today:

- Thank God for how He's provided and protected even when we were unaware of His work.
- Ask God to continually make your heart humbly grateful for all of His blessings.
- Seek to surrender ourselves to only what pleases and honors Christ.


We will not hide them from their descendants; we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, His power, and the wonders He has done.

Psalm 78:4

Often, our lives are shaped by our good and bad choices. We learn from them all. Here the people of Israel are reminded to never forget all that the Lord had done. They were charged to speak boldly of His amazing work and His unmatched power.

Today, let's join our hearts in prayer:

- Ask God to flood our minds with moments where He was so present.
- Pray for humility that we don't take praise for something God has done.
- Pray for courage to share these markers with others as a testimony of how unmatched God is.



Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it.

Proverbs 22:6

A verse giving clear direction to instill wise teaching into the hearts of children. Some versions use the words "train up a child" to clearly indicate a deliberate movement to dedicate a child to a life that is led by the Lord.

Together, let's offer up a prayer:

- · Ask for God's wisdom to fill our mind today.
- Allow God to have total control of situations in our lives where we are struggling.
- Commit our hearts today to stay focused on His Word and do not turn from it.

One generation shall commend your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts. ⁵ On the glorious splendor of your majesty, and on your wondrous works, I will meditate. ⁶ They shall speak of the might of your awesome deeds, and I will declare your greatness. ⁷ They shall pour forth the fame of your abundant goodness and shall sing aloud of your righteousness.

Psalm 145:4-7

We can stand anywhere in the world and see the majesty of His creation; but, He wants a very personal relationship with us. God wants us to know Him and His goodness and pass that on to the next generation. The consistent calling of God on our lives is to proclaim who He is and what He's done to those who will come after us.

Today, we join together and pray:

- Spend time meditating on the glorious splendor of His majesty.
- Pray that the Almighty God will dwell in our hearts and minds.
- · Submit to living today being led only by His hand and will.

Week Five

Seeking His Direction


So we fasted and petitioned our God about this, and He answered our prayer.

Ezra 8:23

Ezra is leading the exiles back to Jerusalem and knows that they will face some obstacles. Ezra needs God's presence. He needs God's protection. Ezra needs God to make the plan work. So Ezra rallied the people to pray and fast. God hears and responds.

Today, we enter God's presence and pray:

- Ask God to show you how He's calling you to fast (see page 4).
- · Ask God for his protection.
- Pray for God to accomplish His plan in your life and in the life of FBCT.



When I heard these things, I sat down and wept. For some days I mourned and fasted and prayed before the God of heaven.

Nehemiah 1:4

Nehemiah is broken over the fact that Israel has been exiled from Jerusalem and that the wall has been torn down. He is broken for the generations that might stay exiled because Jerusalem has been destroyed. His brokenness moves him to weep, mourn, fast, and pray. But Nehemiah does not stop with fasting and prayer. He takes action. Nehemiah comes up with a plan and gets his hands dirty so future generations will not live as exiles.

Today let us pray:

- For God to gently break our hearts for the things that break His heart.
- For future generations to see God move and work because of what He is doing at FBCT right now.
- For God to show you how He wants to use you to reach future generations.



...pray without ceasing... 1 Thessalonians 5:17

Paul wrote to young believers in Thessalonica to challenge and encourage them to live holy lives. In the midst of the list on holy living, he says, "Never stop praying." Paul understands that in order to live a godly life one must stay connected to God. We stay connected to God through prayer.

Today, stay connected with God in prayer:

- Before you leave the house today, pray asking God to help you make the most of the opportunities you will have today.
- At the top of each hour, take a few minutes to talk to God.
- Take a walk and talk to God about the things that are on your mind.
- Before you go to sleep, thank God for all that He has done for you.

April 2

Let me hear in the morning of your steadfast love, for in you I trust.

Make me know the way I should go, for to you I lift up my soul.

Psalm 143:8

In Psalm 143, David is desperate for God to answer his prayers. He needs God to show him where to go and what to do. We have all been there. We need God to show up immediately in the situation. We need God to show us where to go and what to do.

Spend some time today listening for God to speak. Slow down. Remove all the distractions. Listen for...

- · God's presence.
- · God's guidance on...
 - · What to do.
 - · Where to go.
 - · How to give.


Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Philippians 4:6-7

Anxiety has become an epidemic. All of us are anxious about something – the future, who to marry, where to go to school, what to do with aging parents, etc. Paul gives us some tips that can help us begin to handle our anxiety. Pray about all that is on your mind with thanksgiving and allow God's peace to protect your mind and heart.

Today we come to God in prayer:

- Reflect on what makes you anxious. Make a list.
- Thank God that He is present and concerned.
- Ask God to stand guard over your heart and mind today.



So I say to you: Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. ¹⁰ For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened.

Luke 11:9-10

Today's verses come from Jesus' teaching on prayer. He tells the story of a person desperately needing the help of a friend. The needy person keeps knocking on the friend's door and asking the friend to help. The friend does not meet the need just because the two are friends. The friend finally responds to the need because of the needy person's shameless audacity.

With shameless audacity, knock on God's door. Seek God. Ask Him:

- · To glorify His name.
- · To accomplish His will in your life.
- To reach the generations with the Good News.

When you fast, do not look somber as the hypocrites do, for they disfigure their faces to show others they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. ¹⁷ But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, ¹⁸ so that it will not be obvious to others that you are fasting, but only to your Father, who is unseen; and your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

Matthew 6:16-18

Jesus expected his followers to fast, but not in such a way that it brought attention to themselves. The religious people of Jesus' day thought they were better than others and wanted others to know when they were practicing their piety. They would rub ashes on their faces to bring attention to the fact that they were fasting. But Jesus says that fasting should be between us and God. Putting oil on your head was a way to make yourself look alive and was a symbol of rejoicing.

Spend some time today evaluating:

- What is God telling you to do about fasting?
- Are you obeying what He is telling you?
- Are you rejoicing as you obey?

Week Six

Trusting His Faithfulness


But the Lord is Faithful. He will establish you and guard you against the evil one.

2 Thessalonians 3:3

Paul gives some final words of comfort to the Thessalonians who are constantly battling false claims about Jesus. He urges the believer to rely on God's faithfulness as a major tool to guard against attacks of the devil. Satan is always looking for a seat at your table, and we must know he will not be successful if we trust in God's faithfulness.

Today, as a church, we pray to:

- Know God is faithful.
- Trust His faithfulness will succeed against the devil.
- Remember we have a firm foundation (established) based on God's accomplishments.



The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; ²³ they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.

Lamentations 3:22-23

God's steadfast love is everlasting. His love isn't dependent on our actions, thoughts, or motives. Even if we have fallen away or felt unworthy, God's faithfulness goes the second mile and never ceases. Not only is His love constant, we are afforded a fresh blessing every day with new mercies.

Today, as we pray, let's:

- Thank God for His unending love.
- Allow ourselves to receive His mercies.
- · Know that His faithfulness is great because of Jesus' love for us.


And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.

2 Corinthians 9:8

Paul emphasizes that God is able to provide abundant grace, ensuring that believers always have everything they need. This abundance enables them to excel in good works and generosity. The verse highlights God's provision and the sufficiency He grants to those who trust in Him.

Today as a body of believers, we pray:

- Thank God for His abundant grace in our lives.
- That God's grace would be a driving force in our lives to move us to do the work God has called us to individually and as a church.
- That we would trust God for His provision.



Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you.

Luke 6:38

Jesus teaches in these verses that generosity leads to abundance, as giving to others results in receiving in return. The measure by which one gives – whether sparingly or abundantly – helps us to understand how open our hands are with the blessings the Lord has bestowed upon us. This verse emphasizes the call to be open-handed and trust that the "earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof" (Psalm 24:1).

Today, as we pray together, let's:

- · Examine our hearts and gauge our trust level.
- Pray we would be faithful with what the Lord has blessed us with.
- · Seek God's will in our own lives and the in life of FBCT.


Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful.

Hebrews 10:23

Sometimes, when life seems out of control, we feel as if all we can do is hold on. The question is: "What are we holding on to?" The writer of Hebrews offers God's answer. He urges us to "hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering," not because of our capabilities, but because "He who promised is faithful."

Today, let's pray collectively:

- That we would recall the steadfast love of the Lord that does not waver.
- That we would never lose hope in who God is and what He has promised.
- And give thanks that the God who holds onto each of us will never let go!



Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. ⁷ Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

2 Corinthians 9:6-7

The economy of God's Kingdom is built on what you can give, not on what you can attain. Paul wants the church at Corinth to be a part of God's work through giving. He reminds them of the rules of the harvest. You reap what you sow. You reap more than you sow. You reap after you sow. Then Paul reminds the readers that giving is a matter of the heart. "Give what you have decided in your heart. Give generously. Give cheerfully."

Today, pray by...

- Thanking Jesus for giving His life to pay off our sin debt.
- Asking God to clarify what your commitment should be to what He is doing at FBCT.
- Asking God to help you live a life of faithful, cheerful generosity to His kingdom work.

Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us, ²¹ to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

Ephesians 3:20-21

Paul reminded the church in Ephesus and is reminding us today that God's ways and thoughts are so much higher and greater than ours. God can do more than we can dream of. When God moves in big ways, it displays His power. When God moves in big ways, His name is glorified. When God moves in big ways, generations will know and worship the name of Jesus!

As we wrap up this phase of prayer and fasting and make our commitments to what God is going to do at FBCT...

- Thank God for what He has already done in our church and what He has taught you over this forty day journey.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to show you what part you will play in glorifying His name and reaching future generations.
- Pray for God to do something BIG in our community, around the world, and in the future for the glory of His name.
