THRIVE IN '25!!

The dictionary defines en.thu.si.asm as intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. Synonyms include ardor, devotion, eagerness, emotion, energy, feeling, fervor, frenzy, fury, and intensity. The word enthusiasm comes from the Greek word enthousiasmos.

I read that ole St. Nick a/k/a Santa Claus caught on in the United States sometime in the late 1700's to early 1800's. For hundreds of years this legend has worked miracles in the lives of so many. How has Santa stayed so loved, so popular for so long, even today? I call it conscious enthusiasm. That term means a person's mindful awareness and joy over something he/she believes in. One person's conscious enthusiasm spreads to another ... it is contagious.

Have you heard and read the many, daily promises, advisories and ads all over the media for "prescriptions" about how to live a better life, a new life? The ads include such things as how to live better with chronic pain; what foods to eat to cure arthritis or what foods not to eat if you have arthritis; how much exercise does a 70-year-old really need and which exercises; how many hours a day is too many on our electronic devices; how to conquer your cluttered mind; how to alleviate depression; ways to lose weight; and it goes on, and on. I'm sure you've read some of these; you might even have tried a few? Oh, I'm aware that some of them just might help. And there's no telling how far and wide the news of any successes spreads. That depends upon the level of conscious enthusiasm emanating from those who spread the news of their experiences.

After we are saved and upon baptism we hear the words "buried with Christ in Believer's Baptism, raised to walk in newness of life." Can anyone receive "newness of life?" Yes, every day can be a new day with Jesus. We must believe in Jesus with all our heart, mind and soul to receive His gifts of newness of life, that forgiveness of sin, that love that only He can give us. We can and must develop a personal relationship with Jesus. But do we have that same conscious enthusiasm for spreading to others the Good News of Jesus that we have in spreading the news that Santa Claus is coming to town?

I did not write this poem but it was written in a Bible I was given in my college days. The author is unknown, but the message is clear... and I like it.

If, as with Herod, we fill our life with things and again with things, if we consider ourselves so unimportant that we fill every moment of our lives with action, when will we have the time to take the long slow journey across the desert as did the Magi?

Or sit and watch the stars, as did the shepherds?

Or brood over the coming of a child, as did Mary?

For each of us there is a desert to travel, a star to discover and a Being within ourselves to bring to life.

This is not the day you quit. This is not the day you cry.

This is the day you stare down every naysayer in your life who doesn't get it yet. Because you do. Finally. And now you know that faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

This is the day you shout, for all to hear, "I Believe."





I started to see the signs pop up around Trussville back in September. The effort was already under way to get young people to register for this year's (2025) version of Disciple Now, which the church is calling "Movement". Even though the event wasn't scheduled until this month (January), our staff members recognized the importance of getting teenagers to commit to it early.

Spencer Jones and Matt Dickey went so far as to agree to live in a box in the parking lot for 24 hours if enough kids signed up. They did and they did. Many hundreds of precious young souls were expected to pack the worship center to praise God and grow in their Christian walk. Some perhaps to be introduced to it.

It's hard to overstate the impact of this. As senior adults, we kind of look at ourselves as the standard bearers for the faith. But each of us can probably remember when we were those teenagers, with so many paths to choose from, so much input coming in from so many different voices, so much life to look forward to, dreams to achieve and hopes to fulfill. A time when our true priorities had not yet been established. When we were open to everything, just beginning to enjoy a bit of the freedom to make our own decisions. Making up our minds about who was worthy of being emulated, and who was a fraud.

We lacked the maturity to control our emotions then. We felt every little life event in a profound way, often soaring from deep depression to ecstatic joy, depending on whether that classmate you had a crush on smiled at you that day. We cared so deeply about what others thought of us. It was so critical to fit in. To have a group, any group, that we could feel a part of.

That was many decades ago for most of us, but those kinds of things never change for young people. Today's teens may have access to far greater technology than we ever dreamed of, but I'm betting their needs are still the same. They want to belong to something. And if the church environment doesn't accept them, they will look elsewhere and find a community that does. And in all likelihood, it won't be a positive one.

I am thankful to be part of a church that truly puts out the effort to welcome youth. A church that makes it a priority to make sure our young get a healthy dose of Christianity to go with all of the secular influences they are under. There are some who feel the world is on the verge of a vast revival and return to God. And many of these believe the revival will be led by youth, not by the elders. Amen! May it be so! And may the youth of First Baptist Trussville be on the front lines of the charge toward Jesus.


