



PART OF OUR JOURNEY

I find myself consistently camping out with reality no. 4 of 7 from the Experiencing God Bible study, first written in 1990, and revised in 2021 with recent real life stories.

God speaks by the Holy Spirit through the Bible, prayer, circumstances, and the church (other believers) to reveal Himself, His purposes, and His ways.

My story is really not my story, it is HIS STORY. It is how God has spoken to me and worked in me and through me throughout my life, and how He continues to do this. It really is all about HIM!

When I was a young boy growing up in Sylacauga and involved in the mission organization, Royal Ambassadors, God led my RA leader to share scripture, James 4:14 one day. God used His Word to speak to me about my salvation, and I was saved shortly thereafter. At age 15, I really thought God was calling me into full-time Christian service, but I could not understand what area. God continued to speak to me, or at least I heard God trying to speak to me occasionally about this matter throughout my high school and college years, but I never knew what He wanted me to do.

Shirley and I married in 1967 and moved to Eufaula in 1969 after graduating from Auburn. Once again God began to speak to me about full-time ministry as a vocation.

As I look back, I think I really know why God was not able to speak to me for about seven years – I was too busy for Him. I have come to understand and truly believe that "busyness is the enemy of spirituality." If you and I are to clearly hear God speak we must "be still" before Him. The reality is "God speaks." The questions for you and me are: "Do we hear Him speak?" "What keeps us from hearing Him?" "What are the barriers you and I need to remove so God can speak clearly to us?"

While attending Sunday School Leadership conferences at Shocco Springs in August of 1979, God spoke to me through the church, one man especially ... Ron Lewis, to help me know for the very first time, exactly what He (God) wanted me to be and do. He wanted me to be involved in a local church serving as a Minister of Education, growing a church primarily through Sunday School. A light did come on! God spoke and what He spoke was clearly understood by me, but I was afraid and faithless.

The years 1979 through 1983 were a season of life Shirley and I will never experience anything like in our lives again. God began speaking to both of us about the same time about the same thing and that was full-time Christian ministry. Shirley shared with her friends in the Young Baptist Women group



what God was speaking to us about, particularly the major adjustments this would require in our lives ... I was struggling with what to do. These ladies began to pray. I know the prayers of other believers, and especially these ladies, over a four-year period of time made a big difference. They just prayed, and God continued very clearly to do the speaking to me and Shirley, as well as Amy and Alan, who were then ages 10 and 7. I am so thankful He kept on speaking and did not give up on me.

During Spring Break, in March 1980, Shirley and I, along with our kids, made a visit to New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. Why New Orleans and not another place? I do not know, except that is the only place that we felt impressed by the Spirit to check out. After spending 3 or 4 days in New Orleans and talking to several people on campus we returned home. Shirley was ready to do what God was speaking to her about, but I was not. Imagine that! But that is the way it was.


For the first time in my life, I experienced fear. "How will I provide for MY family? What about MY job? If WE do this ..." I prayed "God if you really want ME/US to do this, YOU (God) are going to have to show ME some signs." I was not satisfied with God just speaking to me; I now wanted him to show me. "God speaks through circumstances." This is so very true!!

These are just a few of the signs God sent to me and my family to clearly confirm His call to me and to all of us to full-time Christian vocational ministry, and our going to New Orleans for seminary to better prepare for ministry. On March 11, 1980, Shirley and I discussed our saying "yes" to God and that this would demand our total commitment.

That same night during a Weekly Workers Meeting for adult Sunday School leaders, Peggy gave a perfect illustration of total commitment - a story comparing a chicken and a pig. A few days later, Betty sent me a pamphlet entitled "Life Commitment, Special Service." On Friday, March 1, 1980, a picture of our house "mysteriously" appeared in the local newspaper "For Sale" by a real estate company. Shortly thereafter, someone placed a "For Sale" sign in our front yard. That was a real sign if I have ever seen one! Were these mistakes or pranks? I think not. On Sunday, April 6, 1980, Willie Matson had our devotion in Deacons meeting that afternoon and he mentioned about his trip to New Orleans. That very same afternoon when leaving the Deacons meeting, as I travelled up the Talladega highway (Alabama Highway 21), I met a Trailways bus headed for - you guessed it - New Orleans. These buses began to "plaque" me and our family. Their schedules became a little after 12:00 noon and a little after 5:00 pm, each day as I came home for lunch and after work. And then all of our family would see a bus on Sunday as we came home from church a little after noon. Both Amy and Alan came home from school periodically and said something like this, "The Lord must be speaking to us. One of my teachers (or one of my friends) just got back from New Orleans, or we read and studied about New Orleans today." On February 3, 1982, Alan's tenth birthday, I turned on the radio in my car to listen to what I thought was the state basketball tournament. A band was blasting away, so I listened for a few minutes, then a commentator came on and said, "You have been listening to the happy sounds of Mardi Gras in New Orleans." The very next day, on February 24, I saw my dad early that morning (We worked in the same office building on the same hallway in different departments.) and he asked me if I was going to the "seminary" that day. Wow! "The seminary?", I asked. Then he asked me if I was going to the "the seminar" on cost accounting at the Civic Center. Such events continued throughout 1980, 1981 and 1982.

God spoke very clearly and definitely to me through the Bible and through our family Bible study and prayer time on two specific occasions in the summer of 1983. These were extremely defining moments in my life and family. First, Bro. Charles Christmas, one of my heroes of the faith, preached "a stirring message," using Hebrews 11:1-6 for his primary text. The title of his message was "Things I Am Certain Of." Bro. Christmas said, "Faith is looking to God when you don't know what to do." That is where I was! I had known for some time there was a missing ingredient in my life, and I knew what it was – faith. Bro. Christmas said something like this: "We all need "the God ingredient," faith, in our lives."

Second specific occasion: One night during our family Bible study and prayer time, as we were sharing about God speaking to me, really all of us about full-time ministry, Alan, age 11 at the time, shared Philippians 4:19 (CSB), "My God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory through Christ Jesus." God spoke so clearly to me! Any time a child quotes Scripture to a parent, that parent ought to listen! I am so thankful that I listened – finally!



Shirley and I, Amy and Alan, moved to New Orleans on Monday, August 15, 1983 to begin a faith journey that we have never regretted – never. The call of God on our lives is just as fresh, strong and certain today as it was in 1979 through 1983. Not almost immediately, but immediately God confirmed His speaking to us and the response we had just made. I needed to take "a small step" of faith.

With two growing teenagers in our family, I was on a fast track to graduate from seminary in two years on May 18, 1985. Our first contact with First Baptist Church Trussville was a phone call from Sam Booker on the last Sunday night in January 1985. He, Sherman Forehand, and W. B. Burke, served on the Personnel Committee. They, along with the pastor, Dr. Richard Frances, and the church family extended the call to me in March to come on staff as Minister of Education. We began our ministry here on June 1, when Shirley and I were only age 38! I have been extremely privileged and very blessed and grateful to serve under the leadership of Richard Frances, Dewey Corder, and Gary Hollingsworth, and alongside the wonderful people of First Baptist, whom we dearly love!

"How and why" have Shirley and I, and our entire family been so blessed? There is only one answer, "Only God." Only God could have done this! It is all about Him! It is HIS STORY! To Him be all the glory!

No matter what troubles you, Jesus Christ gives us victory over it. Whether you have family discord, financial concerns, failing health, or ungrateful Pilgrims who want to take your land and build a McDonald's on it, you can always have the peace of Christ in your life. You win in the end because Jesus won in the end. And THAT is something to be truly thankful for.

So this Thanksgiving, when you pray the blessing over the food, make sure it comes from the heart. There's so much more to be thankful for than the cranberry sauce.

Intrusive thoughts:

How could Peter when asked "Who do people say that the Son of Man is"? Peter gets the answer so right "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God". Jesus words to Peter "Blessed are you, Simon Barjona, because flesh and blood did not reveal this to you, but My Father who is heaven. I say to you that you are Peter (Petros - a piece of a rock or a stone) and upon this rock (Petra- a large stone) I will build My Church; and the gates of hades will not overpower it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and yet a few days later when Jesus is telling His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes and be killed and be raised up on the third day. Peter takes Jesus aside and began to rebuke Him, saying, "God forbid it Lord! This shall never happen to You". But Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to Me; for you are not setting your mind on God's interests but man's".

Obviously, at this time Peter did not fully understand God's interest, even after his great confession. 




THANK YOU, VETERANS, AND GOD BLESS THE U.S.A.



CELEBRATORS CONFERENCE

What a great 4 days about 70 of us had at the Celebrators Conference in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee. Dr. David Jeremiah was the featured speaker, and he did an outstanding job. He pointed out that 40% of Americans today favor Socialism (Anti-God) and the majority of those in favor are in the 18-24 age



group (we need to educate and encourage them). He discussed the pandemic and how it has shown we are vulnerable, and that life is uncertain – our world is in chaos BUT remember that Jesus overcame the world! DISCOVERING THE WORLD JESUS KNEW

A virtual tour Bible Conference

"Place and story are always connected."

How fortunate we have been to have Dr. Andy Cook return to FBCT for a second incredible virtual tour of the lands of Jesus's time and a study of how they were then vs. how we find them today. How true when we hear "walk in someone else's shoes ... you will get to know them." I am not a bible scholar, nor an historian, but when we study the Bible seeking some understanding of the connection between "place and story" as Andy Cook taught us, not only do the words jump off the page, but so does the how, what, when, where, why and how of what God wants us to know through His Word. I truly have a new appreciation for the archaeological finds being made in recent years and what they mean to the validity of scripture and all that we believe about God and His plan for the world.

Dr. Cook is an excellent speaker and teacher. He speaks as if we are in conversation and teaches with passion all that he has learned and continues to learn about the world that is our God's. My few words here can in no way begin to cover all that Dr. Cook taught on his virtual tour with Google Earth through the Judean Wilderness. Dr. Cook began our sessions with a look at the life of David. I did not realize that as David proceeded to meet Goliath in battle, he picked up five smooth stones to take with him. There is a significance connected to the number 5 in the Jewish culture. When we read David's life stories, particularly in I and II Samuel, we learn of David's struggle with anxiety. He dealt with anxiety? Yes. What did he do to reboot? Dr. Cook's study of this place, along with scripture, connects us to how David faced this giant. David went into seclusion to the caves of Adullam. He went back to basics, and he wrote Psalm 34.

Throughout the next sessions Dr. Cook asked us to follow the timeline. Archaeology begins in the lands of Israel in the 1800's; in 1947 the dead sea scrolls were found; by 1975 some 250,000 artifacts had been discovered; since 1990, just the last 30 years, artifacts uncovered to date number in the millions. Dr. Cook stated that not one single thing uncovered to date has refuted our bible, the word of God. It is eye opening to realize that from the beginning of time until now in God's plan we are in the years of all the best tools ... travel opportunity, maps, technologies, years of what others have learned and discovered, etc. We have the opportunity to know more than those who were actually living in Jesus' day! Turns out our Bible is, in fact, an accurate record of history! Yet, there are so many today who do not believe the Word, much less take time to read and study it. Dr. Cook pointed out that scripture tells us of the passion believers had for the Word, the first five books of the Bible then. They had scrolls and yearned to just get a sight of them! They memorized all of it! Dr. Cook also described the living conditions of the people of Capernaum where Jesus lived and ministered before the cross and his resurrection. Dr. Cook mentioned The Chosen. This series is available on YouTube or The Chosen App. If you have been watching it, you can imagine what it was like when Jesus told the disciples, follow me. He meant leave everything behind, security, belongings, everything and follow me. Back in those days, only 10% of the population were Roman leaders, pharisees, zealots, people with power and money; 90% were just hardworking citizens trying to make a living. As they began to leave their homes, security, to follow Jesus, and thousands did, life was hard. But they trusted God; they believed Jesus was who He said He was; and they wanted to know Him more and hear His teachings. That begs a question Dr. Cook asked us on Wednesday morning: If you had the opportunity to hear Jesus teach, in person, today, would you be willing to leave, under those conditions ... no health care, money, hard work, starvation, no possessions to speak of ... and follow Him??
